Safety Corner



Near-miss Incidents

A near-miss incident is when someone comes close to injuring themselves or another on the job or comes close to damaging property.

For instance, if an officer almost falls while walking down a set of stairs but catches themselves before they fall, this would be considered a near-miss incident. This type of event should not be shrugged off but should be given consideration to help prevent an injury in the future.

Questions to ask might be:

- Was the officer multitasking, such as operating a cell phone and not paying close attention to where they were going?
- Was the area insufficiently lit for the officer to see their next step?
- Was something on the stairs that made them unsafe to descend?
- Was the officer temporarily unfit for duty such as being on a prescription or over-the-counter medicine that made them drowsy?

Near-miss incidents should be reported and investigated, in order to help prevent them from resulting in harm or damage and also to serve as lessons for others to use to learn to avoid a mishap.
